




WHAT IS A COMPREHENSIVE (OR MASTER) PLAN?

Under Massachusetts General Laws, master planning is governed by Chapter 41, Section 81D. This section requires that the plan address nine elements, including a goals and policies statement and an implementation plan.

Within that framework is a great deal of latitude to craft a master plan that fits the individual needs for the community.

understanding gaps in public data and incorporating information from multiple sources wherever possible.


DISTINGUISHING DEMOGRAPHIC TRENDS

COMPARED TO MASSACHUSETTS AS A WHOLE:


- New Bedford has a high share of residents who identify as Hispanic or Latino, multiracial, or some other race not included on the Census
- A high share of residents speak a language other than English at home
- A high share of residents rent their homes
- Fewer New Bedford residents have secondary and post-secondary diplomas
- Fewer residents have access to computers & broadband internet

Housing is increasingly unaffordable to broad swaths of the United States population and a growing concern in New Bedford.


What can and should New Bedford and the region be doing to support housing needs?




OLDER HOUSING STOCK AND A MIX OF MID-SIZE BUILDINGS


HOUSING STOCK BY YEAR BUILT

HOUSING UNITS BY BUILDING TYPE














Approximately 74% of commuters drive alone to work rather than carpool or use alternate
